Share how Bella Mae's story is also my story and there's a little Bella Mae and all of us.

Right before Jesus's triumphal entry into Jerusalem when He came riding on the donkey in Matthew 21

and the people shouted Hosanna Hosanna to the Son of David: Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord; Hosanna in the highest.

Right before this took place Jesus stopped and opened the eyes of two blind men sitting by the wayside. When they heard that Jesus passed by, cried out, saying, Have mercy on us, O Lord, thou Son of David. And the multitude rebuked them, because they should hold their peace: but they cried the more, saying, Have mercy on us, O Lord, thou Son of David. And Jesus stood still.

I noticed something here... the Word of God stood still! Ever notice how when a Word comes from God to you it can make you still? When Christ, the logos of God comes, It brings you to a stopping place from judging your circumstances... from whatever is going on inside you, or around you. The Word, Jesus, brings comfort and peace and causes you to take a deep breath, lay your hands down, rest, be still.

Psalm 46:10 says, Be still and know that I am God. But when you know God, and His word comes to you, and you see Him, that will still you! Jesus knew God the Father, He is the only one who did. Jesus the man stood still. Jesus the man and the Son stood still in the knowing of the Father and the understanding of the Father's heart. You could say God stopped to hear God! To hear the, Let Us! The point is He stood still, to hear the Father's intent and the passion of His heart for these two guys.

Then He called them, and said, What will ye that I shall do unto you? They say unto him, Lord, that our eyes may be opened. So Jesus had compassion on them, (because He knew the compassion of their Father for them) and touched their eyes: and immediately their eyes received sight, and they followed him. - Matthew 20:30-34

Question, Are we above Jesus that we should not stand still and hear before we speak? Have Him discern for us our heart, so it can be in line with His heart, and be filled with His compassion? There is great wisdom here, Christ the wisdom and power and life of God!

There are times, probably for some of us, (maybe no one here haha) but some of us, maybe more than we have cared to admit, but there are times that we need our site

restored as well. I know I certainly have and still do. Before I knew God as my Father, Even before I first believed on Jesus, I didn't need my sight restored.... I needed sight! I wasn't blind physically but I was blind to knowing who God is, to who My Father is, to who Jesus is and the work of the Holy Spirit. And then later I would need my sight restored from wrong teaching about God and deliverance from the lies that had entered into my heart. I often felt like the blind being led by the blind and I'd had enough of that! We're going to talk more about that. But first I have to share this....

Here is a funny thought I had come to me after I read about the two blind guys, and thinking, Hmm The blind leading the blind isn't necessarily always a bad thing!

Hear me out...

Imagine here's these two guys that are both blind right? But they don't know the other one is blind... because they can't see..... First of all, what are two blind guys doing hanging out together?

I imagine one of them was just sitting around and the other one comes walking by and kind of bumps into him. He says to him, Oh pardon me, I'm sorry. What are you doing sitting here? The other blind guy says, I heard of this man Jesus, they say He is The Lord and has come to deliver us! The Son of David, Our Messiah is here! I'm sitting here trying to figure out where He is or where He's going next. The other blind guy says, yes, I've heard of Him too and I've been looking for Him! Let's go find Him together! The other guy says, Hey, do you want to lead the way? The other blind guy says no. It's okay you can lead!

The blind leading the blind!

On The Day of the Lambs, which we know as Palm Sunday, the Lamb was examined not the person bringing the lamb.

It was never the person that brought the lamb that was examined, it was the lamb.

So why are some people so busy with examining others, so busy examining and judging God's Children, His precious flock, instead of the Perfect, Spotless Lamb as the word about their life?

People, even well meaning but misdirected church people, can be so quick to judge outwardly the actions of others when they don't even have a clue as to what's going on in that person's heart.

God never examines us and judges us according to the fruit coming out of us whether "bad" or good. God is the only one who truly knows the heart of every person. He knows what's in their heart and what is causing them pain.

He knows what's in everyone's heart perfectly. But there are people who think they know better than God!

They look at someone's behavior, situation or actions with no discernment from God. So quick to judge and accuse and think they know what that person needs or what they need to do. They look at the speck in their brother's eye without removing the beam in their own.

But the beam can be removed but it can only be removed by you laying down your carnal judgments, what You think is the right thing to do and go to God and ask Him to discern your heart first. To get the beam out of your eye first, then and only then by knowing God's judgment about that person, His good pure perfect judgment. Then He will give you discernment to help your brother and get the speck out of his eye.

Jesus called the ones so quick to examine and judge outwardly, particularly the Pharisees back then and I believe even some right now.... blind guides. They are the blind leading the blind. They are the ones blinded by their own judgments, blinded by the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, blinded by what they think the law says, not knowing the law of God is Eternal Life. They are blinded by death, and the death in this world, blinded from knowing the depths of God's love for themselves. Blinded from seeing the depths of God's love for all humanity and His judgment of Innocence and Righteousness. Blinded to His desire to be joined together with them in oneness and give Eternal Life to all humanity.

The blind they are trying to lead, are also those who have never heard the true Gospel. Who have never been told of The Father, and what is in His hand to give them. Who have been told they must first clean up their own lives in order for God to love them, in order for them to be able to come to Him as Father, The One who has always loved them, cared for them, has always desired to share His life with them, so that they can be persuaded by Him of how much He loves them, finds them worthy and find rest, peace, joy... Life, the Life their heart really longs for. The life only He has in His hands to give them.

Reminds me of a story Jesus told in Luke 18:10-14

Two men went up into the temple to pray; the one a Pharisee, and the other a publican. The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, God, I thank thee, that I am not as

other men are, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this publican. I fast twice in the week, I give tithes of all that I possess. And the publican, standing afar off, would not lift up so much as his eyes unto heaven, but smote upon his breast, saying, God be merciful to me a sinner. I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other: for every one that exalteth himself shall be abased; and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted.

Notice who walked away justified. The one who humbled himself. The one who humbled himself to believe what God's judgment is about him, the one who knew he could not produce God's life in himself by his own strength. The meek one. The one who knew God's mercy, strength and love for him.

Blessed are the meek: for they shall inherit the earth.

I never really understood what it meant to inherit the earth. I think I might have thought it meant getting everything I needed in this world, on this earth as we see it now. If only I could just be meek enough. But I didn't have a clue as to what being meek was either! I don't believe that's what Jesus meant at all! I think what He's referring to is the meek are the ones who are going to live with Him in glorified bodies, in a glorified earth when He brings heaven down to it. And they live their lives fully, now, in the surety and the confidence of their inheritance... and as if it were already here. You walk differently when you know what you've got!

You walk in the earth like Abraham, who being persuaded, by the same faith which was from the beginning and testified of the work which God would do in Christ, and the certainty of things not yet seen looked forward to the eternal heavenly city, with foundations not built by mans hands, but a city that can never see corruption, whose builder and maker is God. Hebrews 11:9-10

Meekness as it is defined in the scriptures, is when the strength and ability of God is exalted in your sight, instead of the strength and ability you see in yourself and in the world. It's when a person makes nothing of their own strength, and the strength in the world, and makes much of the strength of God. It's when a person finds themselves no longer taking thought of their own life, because their mind is filled with the thought God has taken, to give their life the care it needs. The Publican was meek, the Pharisee clearly was not.

Bella Mae page 19 This was so me, before Jesus. I was anything but Meek! Read the page explain... She was looking to the strength of her own ability to have a good life, to sustain her life. Clinging to her broken wing, the hurt, the pain, thinking she was all

alone in the world, without a Father to care for her life... Clearly Bella Mae cold not know the verse in Matthew 6:26

"Look at the birds of the air: they do not sow or reap or gather into barns, (they take not thought to their own lives, or their ability, they are care free) and yet your heavenly Father feeds them, Are you not worth so much more to Him than they?"

Of course! The Father who created the birds knows what they need. He feeds the birds with what He has provided in the earth for them - the seeds, the berries, the worms... He knows what we need too, He feeds us with the strength and ability of His very own Life - Jesus, our bread, our food and our living water for Life, and that sustains us in a world filled with death and corruption, and when we feel the pressing in of it ...

And sometimes He shows us His ability and does provide the things we need as well. He showed me He was my Father and cared for me and what I needed.

Share the story of when God made this real to me, about the birds in Bible college.

Something else that we have learned about meekness is that it produces boldness. Ill tell ya after that, I had boldness, I told everyone about what my Father did for me! Greg taught us what the definition of meekness is BDB Definition: Boldness, to trust, trust in, to have confidence, be confident, to be secure, to cause to trust, make secure! to feel safe, be careless ...

Boldness is what comes out of a person should they believe they are safe. It's what comes out of a person should they understand they are free from the cares of the world, and the cares that pertain to the life the world has to offer.

We have learned here the examples of that in first of all Jesus! He was the meek. Also David and the disciples. And how about the three that stood in the fire Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego. There are many examples we can give of those who trusted in the ability and strength of God and not the ability in themselves or of the world to serve them with life. I found one such person that you may not have thought about and that is the woman that anointed Jesus's feet in the home of the Pharisee.

In Luke 7 The Pharisee invites Jesus to his house to eat....

And, behold, a woman in the city, which was a sinner, when she knew that Jesus sat at meat in the Pharisee's house, brought an alabaster box of ointment, and stood at his feet behind him weeping, and began to wash his feet with tears, and did wipe them with the hairs of her head, and kissed his feet, and anointed them with the ointment.

Talk about boldness!!

Now when the Pharisee which had bidden him saw it, he spoke within himself, saying, This man, if he were a prophet, would have known who and what manner of woman this is that touches him: for she is a sinner. And Jesus answering said unto him, Simon, I have somewhat to say unto thee. And he saith, Master, say on. There was a certain creditor which had two debtors: the one owed five hundred pence, and the other fifty. And when they had nothing to pay, he frankly forgave them both. Tell me therefore, which of them will love him most? Simon answered and said, I suppose that he, to whom he forgave most. And he said unto him, Thou hast rightly judged. And he turned to the woman, and said unto Simon, Seest thou this woman? I entered into your house, you gave me no water for my feet: but she has washed my feet with tears, and wiped them with the hairs of her head. You gave me no kiss: but this woman since the time I came in has not ceased to kiss my feet. My head with oil you did not anoint: but this woman has anointed my feet with ointment. Wherefore I say unto thee, Her sins, which are many, are forgiven; for she loved much: but to whom little is forgiven, the same loveth little. And he said unto her, Your sins are forgiven. -

(He separated her from all the destruction that had come upon her life through death and a conscience stained by sin and death.)

And they that sat at meat with him began to say within themselves, Who is this that forgives sins also? And he said to the woman, Thy faith hath saved thee; go in peace. - Luke 7:37-50

Here is a woman who undoubtedly had looked to her own strength and ability to produce what she thought was life for herself, her whole life. She had looked to the world and what she could find in the world to give herself peace and came up empty. But when she heard of Jesus, when she saw Jesus, which she undoubtedly had, before coming to the Pharisee's house, meekness was birthed in her. Faith was birthed in her. She felt safe. She didn't take into account the caring of her own life or what anyone else would think of her. She saw where Life is found, where strength is found, the life she really longed for and could not find in the world nor produce herself, and she became bold as a lion!

1 John 3:16 says...

Hereby perceive we the love of God, or, (By this we know love), because he laid down his life for us: and we ought to lay down our lives for the brethren. Or (This is how we will love one another).

This is how We come to know, perceive, comprehend, recognize, experience, are intimate with the Love of God:

We see -->He laid down His life for us:<--

The woman pouring out the expensive oil from the alabaster jar washing Jesus's feet with her hair and her tears, became intimate with the love of God for her. She was laying down her inability to produce the life she needed in herself, for His life, for the life only He could give her and love poured out of her. She loved Him in the only way she knew how and He was moved and touched by her love.

For years as I pondered this story and where Jesus said, "He who has been forgiven much, loves much. And he who has been forgiven little, loves little". In my mind I had committed a lot of sins, and knew I was forgiven of them, and I was grateful, but found the inability in myself to love much, or my idea of what that meant. I was still sin conscience, I was still living from a conscience stained by sin and death. It didn't help that I was in a church doctrine based on sin either. What do we call that, The Penal Substitution Atonement Theory? There you have it, not Truth, it's a theory! The Truth is the Cross and the Empty Grave and What That Speaks!

Anyway as exuberant as I was as a young Christian in sharing the Gospel, (more like the perverted gospel), I shared it from the foundation of God the Father couldn't look at you because of your "sin nature" (which is no where in the Bible), and all the wrong things you had done. Because God the Father was angry at man and had to take it out on His Son, so you could come to Him and He could now love you and look at you but only through the Jesus filter. Ugh!!!

I loved God, I loved people but it never felt like enough. Now I know why! Because death was at the root of it all, the focus was not the fruit of it that came out of me, my many sins, but death is what was conquered, my death and Life was in His hands for me and always had been! Listen, I knew I was going to go to heaven one day, I had some understanding but not full understanding. I didn't know what God's forgiveness meant. I had no idea of what beholding the cross, the empty grave and the Resurrection, the Faith of the Father of The Son of God was really all about. I didn't know I could live in that Faith Now. I didn't know He has always seen me and loved me. I didn't know I could experience The Life of The Father in me and with me now! I didn't know I was already One with Him! I would have lived my life and approached people much differently.

It is death we have been forgiven from! It is death that has been sent away from us. It's death we are divorced from! That is the "forgiven much"! That is what I believe Jesus

was saying, Those that understand THE MUCH DEATH they have been forgiven of, LOVE MUCH!

Share Millies story...

Back to our story of the woman who poured her love out on Jesus...This reminds me so much of the song in Jesus Christ Superstar. Called "I Don't know how to love Him" This woman reminds me of her. I saw the play when I was a young girl. The play totally confused me, I do not recommend it at all! But the song stuck with me my whole life. I too wondered: Who is this man Jesus and, How do I love Him? I'm going to take some liberty with this woman with the alabaster jar and the song. And how they both remind me of myself and the questions and inner struggle I had.

The Lyrics
I don't know how to love him
What to do, how to move him
I've been changed, yes really changed
In these past few days
When I've seen myself
I seem like someone else... I'll spare you my singing
— She goes on to say:

She doesn't know how to take Him or why He moves her. She's known so many men before in different ways, and she tries to convince herself He is just one more man like them, that would disappoint her. She doesn't know whether to bring Him down or scream and shout and speak of love, let her feelings out! She never thought she would come to this place, she wants to know what it, what He, is all about. She finds herself in a dilemma and it scares her. Why? Because All her life she had been fashioning, or working her life in such a way that it would appear she had everything under control. So calm, so cool, no lovers fool, running every show. Was she scared He would punish her? Or Was she scared of letting go of everything she'd always known for everything He had for her? Yes I think so! And for me I know so!

Before I knew God, before I knew my Father my Abba. I can tell you I was scared of Him, because I thought what He had in his hand for me was punishment. Even after I became a believer, I was scared because I didn't think I could measure up to all that He expected from me, and that there would be punishment waiting for me.... Then I learned He doesn't expect anything from me except, to receive everything that He has for me! That was scary too because that meant the laying down of my ability to have life. The laying down of everything I knew to make my life safe and secure and appear to

everyone else how calm and cool I was, running every show. I'd have to come to the place where I would totally and completely Trust My Father God. You have to agree, It can be scary to totally entrust your life in the hands of another at first. And you need lots of persuading in this transformation!

I'm thinking about some pastors who have come into the revelation that Jesus is the tithe and now they have to go back to their congregation and tell them God doesn't need their money that that's not what the tithe is all about. That they aren't blessed by how much they give. I imagine that can be pretty scary right?

But I'm so glad I came to that point in my life where I was done. I was tired. I was weary, and I came unto Jesus fully seeing and understanding the same thing He knew about the Father and entrusting my life into His hands. I wanted His faith not mine.

My fear became a different kind of fear. A fear I'm not afraid of! Now I can say I have the fear of the Lord! Meaning I am in awe of Him because I see the only thing He has in His hand to give me is His love and His Life! And I gladly lay mine down!

I knew Jesus was not just one more man. But I came to know, by the hearing of Faith, The Gospel, that He was unlike any other man I'd ever known. And just like the woman with the alabaster jar would come to see, the totality, the complete work of Him laying down His life for her, and the life that could be found in the world, the laying down of the ability He could have enlisted in His own strength before and at the cross, I would become even more intimately acquainted with His Love for me and the forgiveness from death I had been set apart from, divorced from in His resurrection. Knowing He desired that same Eternal Immortal Life with me, with Him forever.

And this is how we love God, by knowing how much He loved us first. By knowing He laid down His life for us. By letting Him serve us with His life and see He has set us apart from death now, to be with Him forever in a glorified immortal flesh and bone body eternally living with Him in a glorified earth. Our inheritance!

Back to the story.

Jesus loved the Pharisee in the story as well. Hopefully the question he pondered in his heart of, Who is this that forgives sin also?, led him to discover. But we do not know. What we do know is God loves the misdirected unknowing, unbelieving and blind guides too. He knows they have just not experienced fully, nor seen the depths of His love for them, or perhaps in a certain area in their own lives and hearts. He knows the areas in their hearts where there is still blindness and they have yet to see and make themselves

available to be persuaded of Him through the Faith of His Son, the perfect spotless lamb of God.

For those who have been told you can't come to God because of all the wrong things you have done, and you don't think God will accept you or can't even look at you and you feel so alone, like an orphan with no one to care for your life. I have Good News for you! That is not true about how God looks at you, how He sees you and knows you nor is He expecting you to clean yourself up.

Getting back to that perverted gospel...

God is not looking at you through a Jesus Filter. Like He can't look at you because He is so Holy, He can't look at you because of your sin and how unholy or "dirty" you are. Like He can only see you really look at you through Jesus once you have received Jesus. No No No that is not what God our Father thinks nor has ever thought!!! That comes from a corrupt theology which separates the Father from the Son! Don't believe it!

So what does our Good Father see when He looks at you, when He looks at all of us? How did He see us long before Jesus even came to earth, even before you first believed?

The same way He always has!!! Because God never changes!

Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and to day and forever! Hebrews 13:8

The Lord hath appeared of old unto me, saying, Yea, I have loved thee with an everlasting love: therefore with lovingkindness have I drawn thee. Jeremiah 31:3

For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved. John 3:16-17

God was in Christ. Reconciling the world to Himself on the cross not imputing our trespasses against us..... or anyone else! 2 Corinthians 5:19

In Genesis we see God created everything! That word for God is Elohim meaning Father, Son and the Holy Spirit of God. John chapter 1 tells us the Word which is Jesus, the Christ, the Wisdom and Power of God was in the beginning with God. Everything that has been created has been created by Him and He Himself is God.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The same was in the beginning with God. All things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made. In him was life; and the life was the light of men. And the light shineth in darkness; and the darkness comprehended it not. - John 1:1-5

John 3:18 says

He that believeth on him is not condemned: but he that believeth not is condemned already,

(not by God, but they condemn themselves by their own unbelief and unwillingness to receive what God has for them)

..because he hath not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God. And this is the condemnation, that light is come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil. For every one that doeth evil hateth the light, neither cometh to the light, lest his deeds should be reproved. But he that doeth truth cometh to the light, that his deeds may be made manifest, that they are wrought in God. - John 3:18-21

How do you do the Truth? You hear it. You let God persuade you of it. You let Him serve you. You believe it. You receive it. You are born from it. You walk in it. You live in it!

The blind men came unto the light, the woman came unto the light! The publican came unto the light...

Don't be left in the dark! The Light, Jesus, has come and shined upon you and is your Light and Life!

In Isaiah 9 we read:

For unto us a Child is born, unto us a Son is given; and the government shall be upon His shoulder. And His name shall be called Wonderful, Counselor, The Mighty God, The Everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace.

Our Everlasting Father!

Now our Lord Jesus Christ himself, and God, even our Father, which hath loved us, and hath given us Everlasting Consolation and good hope through grace, comfort your hearts, and establish you in every good word and work.

2 Thessalonians 2:16-17

Nothing has changed since God got down on His knee in adoration and blessed Adam and Eve in the Garden.

We are His Children, we come from Him. He has blessed us. He adores us as any Good Father would.

God's judgment of us is His righteousness. His commandment for us is Eternal Life!

He has judged sin and death to be far removed from you. You have been divorced from it, that is what the word forgive means and why Jesus could heal the sick and the blind by saying, "Your sins have been forgiven". God has judged You worthy of an immortal eternal life with Him. The very same life Jesus has with Him!

He adores You!

He already calls you Righteous.

Holy.

The apple of His eye.

He loves you and has loved you with an everlasting love, a love from eternity to eternity.

From the very beginning before you were even born, He knew you and He loved you.

You are his treasure in the field.

You are the pearl of great price.

That's what he sees when He looks at you.

He sees His beloved child whom He adores, who He thinks is precious in every way.

He loved you first and He's never stopped Loving you!

He has always known you, been caring for your life. He has always been with you, has never left you and promises He never will.

He cares about every detail of your life. Even knows the number of hairs on your head and how many you've lost and where they are!

I'm thinking of what Jesus said about the sparrows, how not one of them falls to the ground without your Father knowing it. He went on to say even the hairs on your head are numbered by Him. So if He seems to know such seemingly insignificant details about us. He knows everything! And He cares about everything! How much more of value and worth, so precious to Him and dear to His heart, are we to Him than the sparrows?

I spent the majority of my life from a young age making wrong judgments about myself, God and others, believing the accusations of the devil, that I was alone and left to care for my own life. I felt like a little sparrow knocked to the ground without a Father to care for me, thinking I had to build, protect and preserve my own life. Just like Bella Mae. I didn't think He knew me, or saw me, I really didn't believe He was there at all, let alone with me, caring about every detail. But He did and He does!

God knows what has harmed us and hindered us in knowing Him and receiving His love, His truth, His grace and His abundance of life in every area of our lives. The fruit of His Life and Immortality.

He knows it is the death in this world, the death that entered into the world when they ate from the wrong tree. He knows the root and He came as your perfect spotless lamb to destroy that. He came to destroy your death. He took an axe to that tree. He came to provide Himself as the lamb and destroy sin and death: the blindness of knowing Him as your Good Father, as your Abba.

He came to destroy the unbelief in your heart of His Goodness, Acceptance and Love for you. To set you at liberty from the death and condemnation that was coming against you.

The lambs being inspected on the day of the lambs were for the upcoming Passover feast to remember the death that had passed over them in Egypt. It was a "picture" for them to behold and look forward to something. It was a temporary carnal ordinance God gave them that was supposed to bring back to their remembrance the strength of God to deliver them from death and point to - The Lamb God would provide. In the same way, we look to our Lamb, The Lamb of God, Our Jesus, and see death has passed over us..

Jesus knew the Father did not desire sacrifices and offerings, but a body: His body was given for us.

Hebrews 10:6-7 TFT

6 In burnt offering and sacrifice (of bulls and goats) for (their) death You have had no pleasure (because those offerings could never satisfy Your desire to be with them and stand face to face with them in Your love, forever).

7 Then I said, behold (I AM), in the volume (and the midst of the scroll) of the book it is written of Me. (I AM manifest in the flesh) to fulfill Your will O God (to provide Myself, the lamb).

For those who have done the examining and the judging of others, I understand, I was there once too. And just like there was no condemnation for me from God, there is none for you. And hear me when I say this I am not calling you a Pharisee. I am not calling you a blind guide. There may just be something in the way that is blinding you, perhaps a wrong belief in your heart, perhaps a wrong doctrine from a wrong theology that is keeping you from seeing the truth about how God sees you, how God sees everyone and His good judgment and opinion. We have been created to live by God's design, to live from our hearts, Ultimately, to live by what's in His heart. But not everything that's in our hearts or that comes out of our hearts is from God. That is why we really need discernment from Him. We need Him to rightly divide the truth for us.

Sometimes We see as if we're in a fog and our judgment is clouded and we need the fog to be lifted and the only way It will be lifted is by Him. By Him persuading our hearts as we go to Him, as we sit at the feet of Jesus and keep hearing what was in, and is in, His heart and The Father's heart. They are one. Maybe go back and listen to this message again. Above all, Keep hearing the Gospel of Christ. Keep hearing about The Faith of the Son of God, Christ Crucified and The Resurrection and ask God to restore your sight, to give you eyes to see your life and everyone else's life in that. In His Light. He will persuade your heart.

For those who have felt examined, judged and accused wrongly, I hope you walk forward knowing you have never been by God. I pray you understand and hold no harm against those who you feel have wrongly judged you. And you see they are in need of their eyes opened as well and trust God to do that.

I pray you, you would know the Love of God for you and the Lamb, the one given for you so that you would know your death has passed over you. That you would know...

...that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come,nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate you from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord. Romans 8:38-39

Keep hearing the Gospel of Christ. Keep hearing about The Faith of the Son of God, Christ Crucified and The Resurrection and ask God to restore your sight, to give you eyes to see your life and everyone else's life in that. In His Light. He will persuade your heart.

Ephesians 3:14-21 from The Faith Translation

- 14 For this reason I bend my knees (to pray) to the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,
- 15 From whom every family in heaven and earth is surnamed,
- 16 (Asking) that He would give to you, according to (the exceeding) riches of His glory (and good opinion of you), to be strengthened with (His glorious) power by His Spirit in the inner man:
- 17 So that (the Spirit and wisdom of) Christ may (be settled in you) dwelling (permanently) in your hearts by faith (ever) persuading (you of His life and union to you); so that being firmly planted, (rooted and) established in His love,
- 18 That you would be able to (fully) comprehend (and lay hold of along) with all the saints what is (the magnitude of) the width and the length and the depth, and the height (of His love for you);
- 19 And to know (and fellowship with) the love of Christ, which (intimacy) surpasses (all) knowledge, so that you might be filled (and complete) with all the fullness of God (Himself).
- 20 And unto Him who is able (and desires) to do (far beyond) exceeding (all that our hearts ever hoped for) super abundantly above all that we could ask or think (or imagine), through His power (and might alone) which (He) works in us,
- 21 To Him (and from Him is) all the glory in the church by Christ Jesus throughout all the ages (to come), (and for all eternity in the new heaven and new earth) a world that has no end. Amen.
